

RACE REGULATIONS

ARTICLE 1. ORGANISATION

The 56th Ruota d'Oro – 94th G.P. Festa del Perdonò is organised by A.S.D. Futura Team and Pro Loco Terranuova Bracciolini – Piazza della Repubblica 16 - 52028 Terranuova Bracciolini (AR) – ph. And fax (+39)055-9737095 – email: ctbcomm@val.it, will be held on Tuesday 29th September 2026.

ARTICLE 2. TYPE OF RACE

In accordance with UCI regulations art. 2.1.005, the race is an International MU 1.2 Class event, included in the UCI Europe Tour calendar, reserved for the Under 23 category for FCI and UCI affiliated clubs. In accordance with UCI regulations art. 2.10.008 the following points are awarded to the UCI rankings: 30 - 25 - 20 -15 -10 - 5 - 3 - 1 - 1 - 1 to the top 10 finishers. The race will be run under UCI regulations..

ARTICLE 3. PARTICIPATION

In accordance with UCI art. 1.2.049 the event is by **invitation** and entries are to be made by **entry form** to be submitted to the organiser no later than 20 days before the date of the event. As per UCI art. 2.1.005 the race is open to UCI continental teams, UCI cyclo-cross professional teams, national teams, regional and club teams. In order to be admitted, and in accordance with UCI regulations art. 2.2.003bis, teams must enter **5** (five) athletes and, without prejudice to art. 1.2.053, teams will not be allowed to participate with less than **4** (four) athletes.

The teams must confirm the names of the competing athletes and the two reserves 72 hours before the race.

Rules contained in the entry form and invitation letter regulate possible participation expense reimbursements (hotel, meals, other expenses). Team sports managers are responsible for their athletes and other team personnel that are to be officially notified to the organiser at the time of accreditation and must be on board the accredited team car in the race convoy.

To safeguard its image and the one of the event, the Organiser has the right up to the time of the start of the race to revoke the right to participate of any rider or team that doesn't comply with the ethical standards and obligations as per UCI art. 1.1.023.

ARTICLE 4. APPROVAL PAPERWORK

The event takes place on the designated race course as per the following annexed documents:

- Course map • Race profile • Course description • Race timetable • Map and profile of the last 3 km. to the finish line
- Directions for convoy vehicle diversion • Race Director and Deputy Race Director statements • List including addresses of hospitals and emergency facilities along the course • Maps of the start and finish areas with the location of race headquarters including Commissaires, Anti-Doping Control, Secretariat, Press Room and Race Directors headquarters.

ARTICLE 5. RACE HEADQUARTERS AND STARTER CONFIRMATION

Race headquarters will be open from 5:00 PM on Monday 28th September 2026.

Preliminary operations and racing license control will take place on Monday 28th September from 5:30 PM to 7:00 PM, and on Tuesday 29th September from 9:00 AM to 10:00 AM in the meeting room of the Coop Margherita in Via Prima Strada Lungarno, 146, Località Le Coste of Terranuova Bracciolini..

As per UCI regulations art. 2.2.026 bib and bike frame numbers must not be modified in any way.

Race headquarters at the finish will be in the Pro Loco offices in Piazza della Repubblica 16 on the corner with Via Toti, 6, 500 m. after the finish line.

ARTICLE 6. TECHNICAL BRIEFING

In accordance with UCI regulations art. 1.2.087, the team managers' meeting with the Race Directors, the Race Jury and the FCI road cycling department delegate will be held at 10:30 AM on Tuesday 29th September in the meeting room of Coop Margherita in Via Prima Strada Lungarno, 146, Località Le Coste of Terranuova Bracciolini.

ARTICLE 7. "RACE SAFETY" BRIEFING

In compliance with UCI regulations art. 2.2.034 bis the meeting of the Race Directors, the safety manager and the Commissaires' Panel with the police, the drivers of official vehicles, safety motorcycles, first aid service, photographers and tv operators that will be in the race convoy will be held at 11:00 AM on Tuesday 29th September in the meeting room of Coop Margherita in Via Prima Strada Lungarno, 146, Località Le Coste of Terranuova Bracciolini.

ARTICLE 8. RACE START

Team presentation and signing-on operations with all the starting riders will take place from 11:00 AM to 12:15 PM in the Parco Pubblico Attrezzato, Viale Europa following the order given in the communiqué.

The race start gathering will be at 12:45 PM at the race headquarters in Via Prima Strada Lungarno, Terranuova Bracciolini. The start proper will be at 1:00 PM from Viale Europa, Terranuova Bracciolini after a 1.6 km. neutralised section.

ARTICLE 9. RAILROAD CROSSINGS

There are no railroad crossings on the race course.

ARTICLE 10. ANTI-DOPING CONTROL

The Anti-doping control location, in compliance with UCI – ITA (International Testing Agency) regulations, will be in the building of the Parco Pubblico Attrezzato of Terranuova Bracciolini (AR), Viale Europa. An anti-doping control can be requested also by Italian state authorities, in accordance with UCI regulations.

ARTICLE 11. RADIO-TOUR

The race may be followed only by accredited and authorized vehicles equipped with radio receivers able to tune into radio-tour service in Italian and French or English on VHF 169.9125 frequency.

ARTICLE 12. NEUTRAL TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

As per UCI regulations art. 2.3.029, neutral technical assistance will be provided by 3 duly equipped TEAM RACING SERVICE cars. Neutral assistance by motorcycle is not permitted.

ARTICLE 13. PENALTIES

Penalties applied are those set forth only in the UCI Regulations art. 2.12.007.

ARTICLE 14. CLASSIFICATIONS AND PRIZES

The following classifications will be issued:

1. Individual classification by time
2. Intermediate sprints classification
3. King Of the Mountain classification

1. Individual classification by time

The individual classification is determined by the order in which the riders cross the finish line.

The following prizes are awarded to the top 20 finishers, as per the amounts established by International Regulations and Italian State laws. Athletes will be informed prior to the start of the race if there should be other extra-classification prizes as well as their assignation criteria in the event of a tie.

The total amount of the individual classification prizes as established by the FCI road department, is € **6,050.00**

This amount will be paid to the bank account of the ACCPI (Associazione Corridori Ciclisti Professionisti Italiani) - c/o Palazzo CONI - LCP/FCI - Via Piranesi 46 - 20137 MILANO - CF e P.IVA 07419480152) 7 days before the event and the ACCPI, based on the final classification approved by the Jury, will then take care of the subdivision and payment of the prize to each athlete and/or his/her proxy only by bank transfer.

The final prize may vary according to each athlete's taxation. At year end the ACCPI will then send an "overall certification" which must be included in the tax return.

2. Intermediate sprints classification

An award will be given to the winner of each single Intermediate Sprint indicated along the race course.

3. King Of the Mountain classification

The K.O.M. classification is based on the sum of the points awarded at the K.O.Ms posted along the race course.

The winner must have completed the race.

Points 7 – 4 – 1 assigned to the first three placements. In the event of a tie the classification at the finish line will be taken into consideration.

Winners of the Intermediate Sprints and KOM will be awarded local products.

ARTICLE 15. TIME LIMIT

A time limit of 8% of the race winner's time shall apply. This time limit may, in exceptional circumstances, be increased at the discretion of the Commissaires in agreement with the Race Directors. (UCI regulations art. 2.3.039).

ARTICLE 16. FEED ZONE

Feeding by team staff members on foot (only from duly signposted feed zones) and from authorized team cars in the race convoy in accordance with UCI regulations art. 2.3.025, art. 2.3.025bis and art. 2.3.027 is allowed from the 30th kilometre until 20 kilometres from the finish line.

ARTICLE 17. PROTOCOL

In fulfilment of UCI regulations art. 2.3.046, the first three finishers of the race and the winners of the secondary classifications (intermediate sprints and KOM) must appear at the podium near the finish line in Viale Europa for the award ceremony within ten minutes of their having finished the race.

ARTICLE 18. FIRST AID

First Aid will be provided by three ambulances and two race doctors: Dr. Nadia Lazzerini and Dr. Fabio Beretta. The Hospital near the race course is the Ospedale Unico del Valdarno Santa Maria alla Gruccia in Montevarchi – tel. (+39)055-91061

ARTICLE 19. ECOLOGY

In keeping with the ecological drive promoted by the UCI and in order to avoid waste dumping in the environment, participants are requested not to dispose of any waste along the road but to do so only in the designated and duly signposted “feed zones” and “green zones” at km 42 – 66 – 91,5 – 116,5 in the Montemarciano/Loro Ciuffenna Area – km 60. in the Persignano area – km 84.- km 109,5 . in the Piantravigne area – km 130. in the Tasso area – km 157. in the Monticello area of the race course where the organisation will have staff in charge of collecting it. Any infringement of this rule will be fined in accordance with UCI arts. 2.2.025 and 2.12.007bis.

ARTICLE 20. ORGANISATION AND SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Given that the race takes place on widely used provincial and National roads, the Race Directors will take it upon themselves to withdraw any riders that may have accrued a considerable and insurmountable delay which would leave them out of the race's security zone, for their own safety as well as to cause the least possible inconvenience to the ordinary traffic. The delay will be determined accordingly with the time established by the permit and the temporary traffic suspension decree. If riders in the race are overtaken by the vehicle with the “fine gara ciclistica” (end of race) sign they must drop out of the race and ride in observance of the law of the land regarding road travel.

ARTICLE 21. PERSONAL DATA CONSENT

Each registered participant gives consent to the Organization for the free of charge, indefinite and worldwide use, including release to third parties and also for commercial purposes, of his data and images taken during the event in accordance with the Privacy law Art.28 of EU Regulations 2016/679.

ARTICLE 22. GENERAL REGULATIONS

The race may be followed only by authorised personnel with specific technical duties or tasks assigned to them by the organisation. Furthermore, all people and vehicles must be accredited, have their passes and stickers and observe the law of the land regarding road travel.

The Race Director must be notified promptly of any additions or modifications.

The Organiser declines all responsibilities for any damage to spectators or other people, even if unrelated to the event, caused by accidents before, during or after the race, due to actions unrelated to the Organiser himself.

UCI and FCI regulations apply in the event of any other issue that has not been mentioned in this rulebook.
